LOCAL BREWERY NEWS

ALLGATES BREWERY: still waiting for the Brewing Licence for the Hallgate venue from the Council though the premises licence has been granted. Meanwhile Allgates beers are being brewed under the supervision of Jon Provost at Dunscar Bridge and Sandiiway though on a limited scale (Seven Feet, Wigan Junction and Half Devil being amongst the range). Allgates are taking on the new Haigh Hall brewery, bar and shop at the old stables building and plans are progressing well with consideration being taken of whether they should transfer some of the existing equipment to the Haigh site rather than building a new brewery. Allgates have also now acquired the Horse Box Bar – a mobile which can be hired for use at functions. Planning and a licence now obtained for the storage unit by the canal at the Pier to include a bar.

HOPHURST BREWERY: Cosmati (4.2) American Pale Ale has been picked for GBBF 2016 – thanks to BLO Darrell for his support to achieve this. Evolve number 1 has been really popular and Evolve number 2 will be brewed in the next 2 weeks. A cold room has been set up in the new unit and works are on-going to make room for new fermenters. The Premise License was refused for 35 Hallgate so the brewery is actively seeking alternative premises.

MARTLAND MILL BREWERY: After the great response to the Chocolate and Oatmeal Stout Arctic Convoy, latest beer Bomber's Blonde was launched in mid June. Again this has proved to be a fantastic success and the feedback has been very positive. They are now working on the next three beers in the core range, with many potential names being put forward for consideration.

The Brewery will be providing the Beers and a bar for the First Annual Parbold Ukulele Festival being held at the beginning of August and are looking to make this an annual undertaking.

MAYFLOWER: Now in full production in Docherty's. Alan Brannigan now has a business partner who owns Cheeky Beers in Bolton and the partners son assists in the brewing and markets the beers. Core range are Douglas Valley, Lancashire Stout (which will be available at the forthcoming Left Bank festival in Manchester) and Wigan Bier (a previous popular beer now brewed using a different hop strain). Alan will be brewing an amber, more traditional bitter later this week. Alan also plans a couple of new recipes – details to be provided soon !

PROBLEM CHILD BREWERY: Making slow and steady progress and hoping to brew a strong beer of around 9% ABV for the Bolton Iron Man.

PROSPECT BREWERY: Bottled beers are selling well at Booths and Prospect are now brewing especially for them. Nutty Slack will be at GBBF. The brewery collected awards from the Lancashire Cup event with Cascade Blonde winning champion in the bitter category and then coming in silver position for supreme champion.

WILY FOX BREWERY: sales are exceeding expectations. Special beer for June, Spirit of '66, sold out by 15th June. Their beers have been on at Cuerden Beer Festival where the Blonde Vixen was the first beer to sell out and the Crafty Fox was third. Crafty Fox was also first beer to sell out at the Pendle Forest Beer Festival. The brewery are very happy with the positive feedback they are getting on their beers. Their latest beer Molten Gold a 4.3% quadruple hopped summer beer is doing very well and by popular demand will be brewed again.

LOCAL PUB NEWS

The Railway in Parbold was voted as Pub of the Season (Summer 2016) at the last branch meeting. Congratulations to the team! Presentation Date to be confirmed.

The Royal Oak, Standishgate has undergone a full refurbishment and opened on 24th June. The theme of the pub is in-keeping with the Fifteens style pub décor and it has 5 handpulls serving Real Ales.

Moon Under Water, Wigan has reopened after a refurb.

Tap and Barrel has hosted its first Beer, Cider and Sausage Festival in July and which has proved to be a great success. Following on from this they intend to host other such events throughout the year.

Wigan Central has been voted the Regional Cider Pub of the Year for 2016. They are overjoyed by the result and want to invite all CAMRA members to the presentation which will take place on Saturday 20th August at 2:30pm. They also hosted their 1st Beer and Cider Festival over the weekend of 8-10th July and wanted to thank all their customers for a fabulous weekend.

The Silver Tally tenancy has been taken over by Alison who was the long standing manager whilst it was part of Prospect Inns. Business as usual same manager, same commitment to real ale, still selling plenty of Prospect Beers with the only difference being Prospect no longer pay the rent.

Docherty's has been accredited with the Locale Award 2016. The presentation will take place at the branch meeting in Docherty's on Tuesday 16th August.

Crown at Worthington – As mentioned in previous newsletters, the Crown has closed its doors for good and there are plans to demolish it. Locals have arranged a petition to save this historic and community central pub and are looking for signatures.
